

Crime prevention advice

If you're heading away on your summer holidays over the next couple of months, it is important to take steps to secure your property from opportunistic criminals.

- · Securing your property. Making sure windows, doors and outdoor buildings are secured and locked before you plan to go away for a long period of time.
- Setting up security lights with sensors or timers to come on in the evening to make it less appealing to potential criminals.
- Installing doorbell CCTV that activates when somebody enters your driveway. Be sure to do your own research on different types as some require a subscription service to playback footage.
- Like outdoor lights, you can also set lights and other devices to come on inside your property to make it appear as though people are home.
- Ask your neighbour or family to park a vehicle on your drive while you are away.
